LHFIG meeting - 23rd April 2024

- 1. Purpose of the report
- 1.1 To invite the council to note the current status of the council's outstanding Community Issues.

2. Budget

2.1 The present budget as of 1st April 2024 is £85,516 with £48,520 committed to approved projects, including anticipated contributions from those councils with approved projects. £36,996 remains unallocated to fund new projects in 2024 however Wiltshire Highways has manpower issues in respect of servicing additional projects.

2.2 Summary

Community Issue	Description	Status
7-23-12 Priority 1	Request for no waiting restrictions at the far end of SBLR to prevent inconsiderate parking preventing householder vehicle access	TRO consultation process commenced by Wiltshire Highways. Consultation document in preparation, publication expected shortly.
7-23-19	Concerns about speeding vehicles from the Priory roundabout along the B4042 to Cowbridge	Atkins will be asked to give priority to the Speed Limit Review along this stretch of the B4042. Report available - conclusion that the existing speed restrictions are appropriate, identified hazards at junctions should be mitigated by infrastructure changes/SID installation. Item closed.
7-23-20	Concerns about speeding vehicles from the Priory roundabout along the A429 within the 30mph restriction	A traffic survey has been requested along this stretch of road as a precursor to the installation of a SID at the northern part of Burton Hill in the vicinity of the PCC. Speed data report awaited.
7-24-02	Highway hazards at Common Rd/A429 junction.	WH will not install a mirror opposite the junction as it is not policy. The LHFIG suggest a small improvement could be achieved if the hedge on the southern side of the junction is trimmed back; parish council to action with the landowner. Item closed.
7-24-03 Priority 1	Improve the visibility to motorists of the zebra crossing by the Priory roundabout in Burton Hill	WH not in favour of installing illuminated posts like those in Tetbury, however LHFIG agreed to incrementally implement improvements ranging from cleaning the posts, replacement high intensity globes and finally illuminated posts. The parish council asked to agree a contribution of up to £3K to cover estimated full project costs.
